

Potential Age-Appropriate Assessment Tools (2014)

The Division on Career Development and Transition (DCDT) of the Council for Exceptional Children (CEC) defines transition assessment as an “ongoing process of collecting data on the individual’s strengths, needs, preferences and interests as they relate to the demands of current and future working, educational, living, and personal and social environments”. “age-appropriate” means a student’s chronological rather than developmental age (Wehmeyer, 2002).

During grade nine, the IEP shall address the student’s needs for transition from secondary services to postsecondary education and training, employment, and community living. To appropriately evaluate and plan for a student’s secondary transition, additional IEP team members may be necessary and may include vocational education staff members and other agency representatives as appropriate.

Formal and informal transition assessments should:

- Provide relevant information about the student in relation to employment, postsecondary education and training, home living, community participation and recreation and leisure areas for transition planning;
- Provide a basis for the student’s measurable postsecondary goals; and
- Provide a basis for measurable annual IEP goals.

Informal assessment consists of gathering existing information on a student, and reviewing and compiling that data to make decisions about future goals. This information may include:

- Interviews or questionnaires;
- Direct observations;
- Anecdotal records;
- Environmental or situational analysis;
- Curriculum-based assessments;
- Interest inventories; and
- Transition planning inventories.

Formal assessments are performed by trained personnel and can include:

- Adaptive behavior or independent living assessments;
- Aptitude tests,
- Interest assessments,

- Intelligence tests;
- Learning style inventories;
- Personality and preference tests;
- Career development measures;
- On –the-job or training evaluations;
- Measures of self-determination.

What kind of information can be gathered for age-appropriate transition assessments?

- Functional life skills;
- Reasoning and problem-solving skills;
- Learning styles;
- Communication skills;
- Self-awareness and self-advocacy skills;
- Assistive Technology checklist;
- Transferable skills;

Students must have their strengths, interests and preferences determined. Here are some examples of what those are.

- **Perceptual skills:** ability to judge where, how, and if things fit together.
- **Interpersonal skills:** attitude, cooperation, teamwork, and communication skills.
- **Work aptitudes:** ability to remember and follow instructions and procedures; ability to plan, organize, and improve with practice.
- **Work behaviors:** ability to concentrate and stay on a task and ability to remain motivated.
- **Interests:** personal goals and interests, hobbies, leisure-time activities, academics, and favorite and least-favorite subjects.
- **Cognitive skills:** reading and math skills, concept formation, thinking style, and problem solving abilities.
- **Motor skills:** using one’s hands, eye/hand coordination, fine motor skills, and mobility.
